19. Dear Lord,
As the angels sang praise to God in heaven, we give thanks for the gifts of music and song in our schools. For those who teach music, for the opportunities of learning instruments and for all the opportunities to sing and share together. In Jesus' name. Amen.

20. God of Grace,
We are called to “go” and “tell” of the good news of Jesus and to shine our light in dark places. We give thanks for our schools as places where good news is shared and celebrated. Help us to share that good news about their work with others in the community, that we too can shine your light into their lives. Amen.

21. Lord God,

3. Eternal God,
In Advent we learn more about the names of Jesus - Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. We pray for our local schools in and around the parish by their nameand ask your blessing for all who learn and work there. In Jesus' name.
Amen.

4. Lord God,
In Advent we look to the past and see how you fulfilled your promises to the prophets. Today we remember the past generations who have learnt and worked in our schools. We give thanks for every lesson learned, every prayer prayed and every life transformed. Help us to look back with gratitude and forward with hope.
Amen.

5. Spirit of God,
Advent is a time of preparation. We ask for your spirit of wisdom and understanding for those who lead our schools and your guidance for the many decisions they face. We pray you will guide and support them throughout this season. May they know your presence with them, on this and every day.

6. Loving Father,
As we share more of the biblical story together through Advent, we give thanks for the power of stories and for the times of collective worship shared together as a school community. 10. Dear God,
As Jesus discovered both the best and hardest parts of living on Earth, we remember that he had friends to share it with. We give thanks for our schools as places of friendship, where life-long relationships are forged and nurtured. We give thanks too, that in our own journeys of faith, we are never alone.

11. Holy Spirit,
Sometimes we, like Zechariah, have a hard time believing things we cannot see or make sense of ourselves. We give thanks for the many wonderful opportunities in life that we didn't expect, for the unexpected joys that are found in learning new things. We give thanks for all who create life-changing opportunities for our young people to experience the 'life in all its fullness' that Jesus promised.

12. Dear Lord Jesus,
The Advent season enables us to anticipate the joy of Christmas morning and be ready for what is to come. We pray today that our schools will be places of joy and anticipation, energy and delight. As we give thanks for those things, we pray too that there will be times of rest and restoration for those that need it, so all can be refreshed and excited for the joys still to come.

13. Living God,
As Mary was noticed by God, you notice each one of us and care about all that we are. We give thanks for the uniqueness of every pupil and adult in school, their skills and talents, the things they enjoy, the worries they face. Help them to find direction and purpose in their living, loving and learning together, so that they can achieve all that you hope for them.

You revealed through Jesus' birth at Christmas that our relationship with you can be close and personal.
