## Remote Learning Plan

Work can be uploaded and teachers can be tagged when work is sent back by individual children for marking and feedback <br> - Subject Specific Resources used; <br> - Maths - NCETM pre-recorded lessons and resources/ White Rose prerecorded lessons and resources <br> - Use of an Oak Academy/ BBC Teach/ BBC Bitesize/ STEM for prerecorded lessons and resources. <br> - Use of sites for mental and physical health used - Jo Wicks/ Cosmic Yoga/ <br> - Sites that school has subscribed to and every child has their own login and password - BugClub/ SPAG.com/TTRockstars. <br> - Well-being activities - a bingo style card of approximately 16 activities to choose from to do such as baking, art activities, walking and exercise, outdoor learning focused. <br> - Topic / subjects taught in class - Teachers will upload the resources/ worksheets at the end of the day. The child will be at the same point in their learning as their peers when they are able to return to school. <br> - EYFS/KS1 - resource packs (phonic focused) will be sent home to be used by children. | - Regular calls to check wellbeing for those shielding <br> - Microsoft TEAMS to the individual child if not having regular contact <br> - Delivery of hard copy resources where needed <br> - Weekly phone calls to those who are not communicating via TEAMs |

| In the event of local or national lockdown - full school closure | - Daily live meeting on TEAMs with teacher at the beginning of the day to explain the day's work. <br> - KS2 - daily live meeting with teacher at the end of the day as a check in to share learning, address misconceptions, answer any questions and celebrate learning. <br> - EYFS/KS1 - daily pre-recorded story read by the teachers is uploaded on TEAMs. <br> - Overview of the weeks learning is uploaded at the start of the week - this will be similar to a typical weekly timetable in content coverage and length of time for each activity. <br> - $\mathbf{3}$ hours of learning will be provided for key stage one. The nature of this provision with be different for EYFS with a greater focus on activities for learning through play prioritised. 4 hours of learning will be provided for key stage two <br> - A sequence of ambitious and meaningful lessons which builds on the previous learning - misconceptions are addressed daily in the TEAMs calls. | circulated to those who cannot access the technology: <br> - Weekly phone calls to those who are not communicating via TEAMS <br> - Technology available to those who do not have a computer <br> - School recognises that that not all families will be able to complete the content delivered on a daily basis. Teachers and members of the SMT will ensure families do not feel under additional pressure to maintain a perceived amount of work every day, especially if they have multiple siblings requiring support. |

- Lesson resources is uploaded onto Teams daily. Any resources made will include audit clips of all writing and visual clips will be used wherever possible to ensure that everyone can access the learning regardless of their individual needs.
- Daily Collective Worship as on timetable - delivered by the church and school. Celebration assembly every Friday - certificates/ stickers given virtually to children in their private channel.
- Communication between staff and pupils through the day in the form of questions via TEAMS
- Feedback - teachers will continue to provide regular constructive feedback. These may be in the form of questions or comments. Questions to be given in a timely manner, which the children should respond to.
- Remote learning will be delivered to the same timetable as in school learning to ensure children attending school on a part time basis can maintain continuity of learning.
- All work posted is seen, most work will receive a comment, some work will be marked in detail.
- Additional pastoral support is available in partnership with JustBe.

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| In the event of a staff member receiving a <br> positive test and being in isolation for 10 days, <br> assuming they feel well. | The bubble will close and we will revert to lockdown remote <br> teaching and learning as detailed above. |
| In the event of isolation for 14 days due to <br> contact with a positive case out of school <br> (e.g.: Track and Trace) | The bubble will remain open and will be covered by another <br> member of staff where possible |
