Following on from the February newsletter we are pleased to share 'A guide to Parental Controls' which provide helpful information on making the most of the parental controls on a wide range of devices.




Children's Mental Health Week

The staff and children have enjoyed exploring the theme of <u>Growing Together</u> during this week's Children's Mental Health Week. We are pleased to share some of our learning below.

As children grow their brains are growing and changing. We all have the opportunity to grow and develop in whatever directions we choose. With repeated practise the brain's pathways strengthen. Children can do this more quickly and easily than at other stages of life.

Growth does not have to be about developing new skills, it can be about making changes that will help us to feel better. We need to practise being brave as we have been discussing in worship showing courage such at putting up our hand in class, being willing to make a mistake, and be open to new challenges.





Sleep is incredibly important for our brain's growth and development. Really important things happen whilst we are sleeping that helps us to grow

and develop – our bodies and brains remain active and engaged during sleep. It is recommended that teenagers get between 8-10 hours of sleep EVERY night.

There are individual prizes to be won and also the prestigious Champion District School Trophy awarded to the winning school or local junior club.


The tournament will be played as a 5 round Swiss Tournament (i.e. winners play winners and losers play losers). Each game (round) will last about 20 minutes.




World Book Day
