#### **COVID Update**

As with many other schools and sectors we are experiencing a much higher than usual level of staff absence. Please be reassured we are and will continue to do everything possible to protect in person education for all children.

We understand the potential for families to find themselves facing different challenges over the coming weeks and months. We would like to reassure families we are here help.

#### **Getting to School Contingency Plans**

We appreciate that getting children to school if one or more parents or family members has COVID can be difficult. It is important however that families consider contingencies of how they will enable their children to continue to attend school if the person who usually brings them to school is ill or having to isolate.

Thank you to everyone who has already helped another family with taking and collecting another child. We know many families already help each other through existing support and friendship networks.

We are keen to play our part to ensure everyone feels supported. To do this we have created this very short <u>Helping Hands Form</u> where families can offer their support. This is entirely optional and all information will be treated in confidence. It will not be shared without contacting volunteers first. #### **Start of Day Punctuality & Access**

The school day starts at 8.45 with the gates open from 8.35. The gate will be staffed till 8.50 and remain unlocked till 9.10 recognising that occasionally in exceptional circumstances families may run late. If children arrive after 8.50 and the side gate is locked please enter school via the main front door.



#### **Attendance**

Despite the many challenges of COVID and the usual autumn bugs we are pleased to report the following.

- 55 children achieved 100% attendance for the whole of the autumn term
- 94 children achieved 98%+ attendance for the whole of the autumn term
- 140 children achieved 96%+ attendance for the whole of the autumn term.

In the autumn term school attendance was 94.6% with a national expectation of 98%. We acknowledge the impact of COVID cases in the second half of the autumn term on this overall figure. Thank you to everyone for supporting their children to attend well.



#### **Behaviour Merits**

A huge well done to all the children for working together over the autumn term to achieve an enormous 9214 merits.

Congratulations also to the 59 children who achieved their '50-Merit Certificate' during last term.

We look forwarding to continuing to award merits and milestone certificates throughout the Spring term to everyone living out of vision of Love, Learn, Shine and showing they are being READY, RESPECTFUL and SAFE.



#### **Snow and Ice Access Contingency**

It may not always be possible to clear and grit the full one-way system of paths around the whole school throughout the winter. If this is the case we may apply the following contingency plan.

Paths to the main front door and the double doors at the front of school will be cleared and gritted. A path across the front the playground to the gate leading to the car park exit will also be cleared and gritted.

Children in Year 5&6 will enter school through the main front door. All other year groups would access through the double doors leading into the hall. Parents can then exit via the gate into the car park. Staff will be in classrooms to greet children and there will also be staff on hand in the hall and corridors to help guide and supervise children to their classrooms.

We will endeavour to alert families via text as to if these arrangements are needed.


Adults can exit through these gates after drop off.

#### Partnership Book Reminder

Please can children bring their partnership book to school every day.

There is a page for each week including a daily space for recording reading notes at home and school. There is a space for homework to be recorded also. In the space for parent/teacher comment we encourage parents where they have time to record words of positive encouragement for your child.

Books will typically be checked by staff when hearing children read and setting homework. As such they will not check them daily. If you need to get a message to your child's class teacher please do this by speaking to them at the start or end of the day (for brief messages) or email the school office to arrange a time to speak to them in more detail. Please do not use the partnership book for messages to staff as they may not be seen in time.



#### **Snack Trolley & Snacks from Home Reminders**

Our daily snack trolley contains;

Monday - Thursday. Whole pieces of fresh fruit e.g. apples, bananas, fresh fruit pots/fruit kebabs, raisins, breadsticks, vegetable sticks, milk.

Friday (Treat Friday) - As per Monday-Thursday but also fruit juice, milkshake and one sweeter treat such as flapjack/blueberry muffin.

We respectfully ask that snacks from home mirror what is available in school. Children may have crisps as part of their packed lunch but are respectfully asked they eat these at lunchtime and not snack time. Crisps should not be brought as snack any children having a school lunch.

Children in Early Years and Key Stage One will continue to receive free school fruit.





#### New Menu

Please see attached the new menu for this term. Monday 10 January will be the start of Week 1.

#### Free School Meal Funding

Free school meals are available to all key stage one pupils through Universal free school meals and also to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of certain benefits.

To qualify, a parent/guardian must fulfil one of the following criteria

- Universal Credit, (provided they have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- A run-on of Working Tax Credit paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

If you think you may qualify for free school meals, and the other benefits this may offer, please complete the appropriate application form attached.
