

Literacy

This term we will be looking at a mix of non-fiction and fiction texts. -



We focusing on recall of facts and knowledge from the non-fiction books and retelling of stories through our fiction texts.

Phonics

We will be continuing to consolidate and build upon our phase 3 sounds we have learnt. In addition to this, we will be learning new tricky words, compound words and writing full sentences too. By continuing our group reading sessions we will be focusing on reading with less verbal decoding.

Communication and Language

Developing our listening, understanding and reasoning skills, the first part of this term we focusing on questions. Specifically, what a question is and how to answer questions in full sentences.

We will be continuing to build on our ever growing vocabulary through our new topics and we will have opportunities to embed and use our new found vocabulary in small groups and in front of our classes. In the latter part of the term we will be focusing on language and vocabulary related to story telling. This will include repeated phrases, story telling openers and story endings too. We will get the chance to use expression and voices when we recreate and re-enact our stories too.

Expressive Arts and Design

Expressive Arts and Design is woven through our provision and a big part of expressing ourselves in EYFS. We will also be celebrating the Queen's Jubilee with some arts and crafts too!

People who help us -

Through different media we will talk about how different colours are linked and help remind us about different emergency services.

Traditional tales -

We will be acting and retelling the stories we have learnt about and we will create our very own props to help us!

How can I help with my child's learning?

All the top tips on the previous curriculum map are still very important but here are a few extra suggestions of how you can help your child at home.

Literacy/ Phonics:

- Continuing correct letter formation and pencil grip when writing at home.
- Daily reading with your child at home.
- Sharing stories
- Practising writing phonetically whenever possible e.g. Recounts of weekends, shopping lists, cards.

Mathematics:

- Talking about how numbers are made and up.
- Practising number bonds of 5 and 10 using fingers.
- Spotting teen numbers in the environment e.g. house numbers, prices in shops etc.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Through PSHE we will be looking at how we keep ourselves safe and which adults can help us do this. We will be looking at how to work cooperatively in teams to achieve a desired outcome.

In the latter part of the term we will be focusing on transition and moving on. This will include visits to our new classes, meeting new teachers and class friends whilst adapting to new environments.

Mathematics

Building upon previous knowledge of our numbers 1-10 we will be exploring the 'teen' numbers. We will be meeting Numberblocks 11-20 and looking at how they are partitioned. We will focusing on how each number is made with secret hidden 10! When doing this we will also be using and consolidating our number bonds to 5 and 10 too.



In the latter part of the term we will be exploring and comparing a variety of different weights, sizes, capacities and lengths.

Physical Development (Fine & Gross motor skills)

PE - Gross motor -

We will be continuing to move through our REAL PE scheme focusing agility, balance and co-ordination. Through PE we will also be practising and preparing for our very first St Peter's Sports Day! Running, throwing and jumping will be a focus for us in the last half term. In our second PE session we will be continuing to work on our core strength and in our Yoga session each week too.

Fine motor -

Our fine motor activities will help us build the strength in our hands for writing full sentences with our letters formed correctly.

Understanding the World

We will be continuing our learning regarding the changes of the seasons and looking at the ever changing weather and warmer temperatures outside.

People who help us -

We will be comparing emergency service vehicles we see today in comparison to how they looked in the past.

Traditional tales-

We will be exploring different materials and their properties to build different houses, bridges and characters for our stories.

Religious Education-

Over this term we are going to look at how different religions have different special places. We will be comparing some special places and having a think about where our own special place is and why it is so important to us.
