Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of Love Learn Shine. Safeguarding covers a range of areas including the safe management of staff, volunteers and visitors, the safe management of all school activities, strong and secure child protection procedures and developing children's understanding of how to keep themselves safe in the modern world.

Growing up in North Yorkshire Survey

This term children in Year 2 & 6 will have the opportunity to help contribute to the Growing Up in North Yorkshire Survey. This provides schools with anonymised data regarding heath related habits of children which helps inform our curriculum development and health priorities. In addition to contributing to keeping our children safe this helps ensure our neighbours can access their properties safely at all times.


TikTok

Recent research carried out by Ofcom found out that just over half of all 3-17-year-olds are using TikTok. Over the last few months, you may have seen reports in the press about young people coming across inappropriate and harmful content on the platform.

Is TikTok safe for children? Six safety settings to help keep your child safe









We are pleased to share the following updated information with regard to COVID. It includes updated information on isolation, as well as a new expanded list of symptoms:

SYMPTOMS

can include:

- a high temperature or shivering (chills) a high temperature means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste
- shortness of breath
- feeling tired or exhausted
- an aching body
- a headache
- a sore throat
- a blocked or runny nose
- loss of appetite
- diarrhoea
- feeling sick or being sick

The symptoms are very similar to symptoms of other illnesses, such as colds and flu.

THERE IS NO REQUIREMENT TO TEST IF YOU HAVE SYMPTOMS.

It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.

WHAT ACTIONS TO TAKE IF YOU HAVE SYMPTOMS

If you have symptoms of COVID-19, and a high temperature or do not feel well enough to go to work or do your normal activities you should:

- try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people
- avoid meeting people at higher risk from COVID-19, especially if their immune system means they're at higher risk of serious illness from COVID-19, even if they've had a COVID-19 vaccine

You can go back to your normal activities if you:

- feel well enough to do so
- do not have a high temperature

CHILDREN - WHAT ACTIONS TO TAKE IF YOU HAVE A POSTIVE LFT OR PCR TEST

If a child or young person aged 18 or under tests positive for COVID-19, they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This starts from the day after they did the test.

Children and young people tend to be infectious to others for less time than adults. If they're well and do not have a temperature after 3 days, there's a much lower risk that they'll pass on COVID-19 to others.





COVID Vaccination Option



Vaccinating 5-11-year olds

On 16 February, the Government accepted advice from the JCVI to make a non-urgent offer of Covid-19 vaccines to all children aged five to 11, to increase protection against potential future waves of COVID-19. The National Booking Service has opened and bookings for children aged 5 to 11 can now be made.

This will not be an in-school offer, except where SAIS providers are used to provide vaccinations in special educational needs (SEN) schools.

The NHS is already vaccinating children aged 5 to 11 who are most at risk of Covid-19 or who are a household contact of someone who is immunosuppressed.

The <u>National Booking Service</u> (NBS) shows available appointments and there is also a site finder to locate vaccine walk-in centres which is updated regularly. This finder shows which doses are offered at each location and to which age groups.

Attendance Update

Attendance for the whole school for the year so far is 94% with a national expectation of 97%. We appreciate the impact that COVID has had on this figure.

29% of children have attendance of 98%+ and 50% of children have attendance of above 50%. You can help us keep improving our attendance figures by ensuring your child attends every day.

We of course do understand that children are occasionally ill and we are grateful where families inform of as this as soon as they know.

As we start the new term we will be reminding all the children of our three core expectations that ensure our behaviour enables everyone to Love Learn and Shine.

So far this year 22,845 positive merits have been awarded. 96% of children have 50 merits or more and 28% pf children have 100 merits or more.

A superb 75% of children a 100% positive behaviour records which means they have earned only positive merits and have reived no negatives at all for the year so far.
