Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of Love Learn Shine. Safeguarding covers a range of areas including the safe management of staff, volunteers and visitors, the safe management of all school activities, strong and secure child protection procedures and developing children's understanding of how to keep themselves safe in the modern world.

We will use this section of the newsletter to keep families up to date with a range of key safeguarding and welfare information.

Community Activities Parent Guidance

The Department for Education (DfE) have updated their guidance to help parents make informed choices about out of school settings including holiday clubs.

We know many of you make use of the excellent service provided by Fun Club but also sometimes access other options during holidays. We hope you find this information helpful in making informed choices.

Self-harm: proposed updated guidance (NICE)

Self-harm is an umbrella term for intentional self-poisoning or self-injury, and is one of the most common reasons for hospital attendance.

Self-harm can occur at any age.

The Association for Child and Adolescent Mental Health (ACAMH) has a useful <u>article</u> which parents may find of help if they have any concerns about this potential risk.

Carers' Resource

A carer is someone who, without payment, provides help and support to a friend, neighbour or relative who could not manage otherwise because of frailty, illness or disability. They may be juggling paid work with caring responsibilities at home. Carers have a tough job – it can mean unrelenting pressure, little chance to relax and a lot of worry. The system is complicated, and the issue is hidden.

<u>Carers' Resource</u> provides support for carers, no matter what their age, race, religion or needs.

Year 6 Leavers Hoodies

We have been pleased to present our Year Six children with their leavers Hoodies this week. Thank you to the parents and staff involved in arranging the Hoodie order this year.

Having listened to feedback we are delighted to have made them available from earlier in the year than previously.

We are happy for Year 6 to wear these hoodies throughout the remainder of the term. We politely request and remind children and families that full uniform (shirts and ties) or St Peter's summer polo shirt or summer dress are worn below the hoodie on usual days and a plain white T-shirt worn below on PE days. All other uniform also remains in place. If we are concerned that other uniform expectations are no longer being met we reserve the right to revisit this decision.

We ask that on Church visit days and photo day children have both their hoodie and their usual school jumper or cardigan.






Collective Worship Spotlight


Other News


