
#### **Community School Liaison Police Officer**

Children in Year 5 and 6 Art - we have been studying self-portraits and perspective producing some very careful and thoughtful work.












#### **Physics Poster Competition**

Many thanks and well done to Phoebe and Ariana from Starlings for writing this section of the newsletter.












#### Lower Key Stage Two History Day

In September, we hope to have a parent app and this information will be available on there, but in the interim period we require the forms to be completed. Thank you.






### FOSP Car Wash Save The Date
