Online Safety Alert - 'Huggy Wuggy' It's useful for families to be aware of this character, in case children mention it. It's certainly not a nice cuddly bear. This is a game/character that children are being exposed to on Tiktok and YouTube. The character is named 'Huggy Wuggy' from the 2021 horror game 'Poppy's Playtime' The character sounds like a cuddly bear, but is actually encouraging children to copy some unpleasant behaviours There are also some images in the game and within videos of this character which can be disturbing. Recent **BBC** reports have warned about this. **Digital Parenting Information** Vodaphone have produced range of digital parenting resources which can be accessed here.

They include fairy tales for the digital age, information on how to make digital household rules, and an A-Z on gaming acronyms. Families can also if they wish sign up for their newsletter.








#### **Curriculum Spotlight**

Below is a quote we will be exploring and discussing in the coming weeks. Do you agree? How can you give respect?






### **Other News**




#### Year 6 Transition Event & Year Books

### **Parent Surveys**


We are keen to gather parent views on two aspects pf our work, homework and our updated school website.


