Also known as salah. These are the obligatory prayers performed five times each day. They happen at dawn, midday, late afternoon, just after sunset and between sunset and midnight.

Is the fasting during the holy month of Ramadan. During this time. Muslims do not eat between sunrise and sunset.

An annual Islamic pilgrimage to Mecca. Hajj is a mandatory religious duty for all Muslims which must be carried out at least once in their lifetime.

As Islam is a worldwide faith, Muslims use this term for the worldwide community of Islam.

Qu'ran


The Qu'ran is the religious text of Islam, believed by

chapters which are made up of verses.

Hadith Is the Arabic word for speech, account or narrative.


Shahadah A declaration of belief in the oneness of God and the acceptance of Muhammad as God's messenger.

- Muslims believe in the Five Pillars of Islam faith, fasting, charity, prayer and pilgrimage.
- Muslims believe that God is One and Prophet Muhammad is his messenger.
- Muslims believe that it is impossible to fully capture what God is like in one word so they use 99 different beautiful names.
- Muslims worship in a Mosque mosques have a number of important features. A shoe rack, prayer mats, washroom, the Qur'an, tasbih beads, minaret and mihrab.
- Islamic art represents all art created in the Islamic empire. Islamic art rarely contains images of people or animals. The patterns are geometric and consist of repeating, interlaced or overlapped shapes arranged in complex, intricate patterns.
