Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of Love Learn Shine. We will use this section of the newsletter each week to keep families up to date with a range of key safeguarding and welfare information.

Chain Messages

We have been alerted that some children have received an unpleasant chain message in recent days. Chain messages are very long texts, emails or comments (on a YouTube video etc.) meant to scare the receiver into sending out copies of the message to other people. Some offer a reward for forwarding and others incorrectly suggest bad luck or bad things may follow if not forwarded. Neither of these are true.

Sun Safety

We know children love spending time outdoors, whether in the garden, park, or beach. Their skin is more delicate than adults and can easily be damaged by the sun, even when it doesn't seem strong. It is extremely important to protect their skin.

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Mental Health and Emotional Wellbeing


Do you live in Harrogate, Ripon, Knaresborough or Craven and have a child who faces barriers or difficulty due to social, emotional or mental health (SEMH)?


School Uniform

EYFS - Three Little Pigs


