Snack Trolley & Snacks from Home

Our daily snack trolley will contain;







Monday - Thursday. Whole pieces of fresh fruit e.g. apples, bananas, fresh fruit pots/fruit kebabs, raisins, breadsticks, vegetable sticks, milk.

Friday (Treat Friday) - As per Monday-Thursday but also fruit juice, milkshake and one sweeter treat such as flapjack/blueberry muffin.

We respectfully ask that snacks from home mirror what is available in school. Children in Early Years and Key Stage One will continue to receive free school fruit.

Like last year we are working with <u>Arts Projects for</u> <u>Schools</u>. FOSP receive fundraising from this so every bit helps.


