### Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

#### Scarlet fever

Scarlet fever is a common childhood infection caused by Streptococcus pyogenes, or group A Streptococcus (GAS). It is not usually serious, but should be treated with antibiotics to reduce the risk of complications (such as pneumonia) and spread to others.

As during COVID we continue to follow local and national guidance provided through the local authority health teams. If you have not yet done so please do take a few minutes to familiarise yourself with the information provided in the letters sent yesterday.

#### **PAN Consultation Update**

As per our recent communications with you, we have consulted on a proposed change to our Published Admissions Number (PAN) from September 2024.

At a meeting of the Local Governing Body following the end of the consultation period, all the responses received were carefully examined and discussed in detail. As a result, governors concluded that based on all the information available, and having studied the overall responses, it is in the best interests of the strategic direction of our school to request that trustees consider changing our PAN from 41 to 30, starting in September 2024. This request was then made to our trustees who met at the end of the November.





Following careful consideration by trustees they have decided to approve the request of the local governing body to change the PAN to 30 from 41 from September 2024.

Now this decision has been taken leaders, including governors, will begin working on the overall approach and arrangements we will put in place to implement this smoothly and seamlessly for everyone. We will share our plans with families, and we will make sure everyone is fully informed about class structures and any other changes.




### **Christmas Jumper Day**




