
#### Year 3&4 Performance

# School Management and Communication System

We have been busy this term working to migrate to a new improved management information system 'Arbor'. We will start to use this system from the beginning of the summer term.

All current information held including contact details will transfer over. From the start of the summer term, Parents may notice that emails sent will come from Arbor rather than Scholarpack. In the first few weeks of term please do check your 'Junk' email as initially sometimes emails can go into 'Junk'.

One significant benefit of this system is the Parent App that allows parents to access key information about their child and also update school directly regarding any planned or unplanned absence and change of details or medical information. We will write with further updates next term with regard to the rolling out of this app.

We will be posting photos of entries regularly across on our social media channels during the competition – so, the more the merrier.


### **Sporting Influence Holiday Camps**

### Harrogate Nova Cycling Club

For a number of years now Nova Cycling Club have run a series of training sessions for children aged 6-11 approx. In terms of the sessions themselves:

The sessions run from late spring to early autumn on Tuesday evenings

There are 2 groups - beginners (6.00-6.30) and advanced (6.30-7.15)

The sessions are delivered by fully qualified British Cycling coaches

The sessions take place on the large car park

opposite the army barracks on Pennypot Lane just outside Harrogate. As such they

are on a



tarmac surface but there are no cars to worry about.

The cost is £55 per year for the beginners group and £80 for the advanced group. In addition, there is a £6 fee to joining Harrogate Nova Cycling Club.

Please note: some elements of the above details may be subject to minor changes for the 2023 sessions.
