# Curriculum & Extra-Curricular Spotlight

#### **Curriculum Overviews**

We are pleased to have published our curriculum overviews for the summer term on the class pages of our website. These overviews give families an insight into the subjects and aspects of subjects children will be learning throughout the summer term. We hope families find these helpful in supporting their children.

#### **Reading and Phonics**

Repeated practice of spelling helps children move their new learning into their long-term memory. In Year 1 especially, it is important to try to find time to practise and embed spelling outside of the phonics lessons. This week, children in Year 1 and those in Year 2 still accessing phonics will bring home a spelling book. Children will be given sounds, decodable words and tricky words to practise and learn weekly. They will have the opportunity to put what they have learnt to the test on a Friday, with a guick spelling quiz. We ask that these books return to school every Friday so that children can stick in their words for the following week. At home you could practice the decodable words by asking the children to: read the words, add the sound buttons (dots and dashes) and write the words into their spelling books. You could practice the tricky words by asking the children to: read the words, circle the tricky bit and write the words into their spelling books. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher.

#### Statutory Assessment

Over the course of the summer term children in Year 1, Year 2, Year 4 and Year 6 will take part in various different statutory assessments as all children in these year groups nationally do. All of these take place in their classrooms with the support and encouragement of familiar adults.

The dates during which assessments will take place are published in the diary dates section at the end of this newsletter and families can access more details about these different assessments via the <u>Statutory Assessments</u> page of our website. If you have any questions about these please do speak to your child's class teacher.

## **Coronation Arts Project**

Children from across Upper Key Stage Two thoroughly enjoyed working with staff and volunteers from Edgelands Arts today creating art work to be displayed in the community. Edgelands Arts were commissioned by the Victoria Centre, Harrogate to work with a school to create an exhibition of Crowns, celebrating the coronation of King Charles III. Each crown is unique and designed by local school children including those from St Peter's. The children designed and made their own crowns, that reflected their interests and






#### **Library Visits**

# School Management and Communication System

We have now migrated to a new improved management information system 'Arbor'. All current information held including contact details has transferred over.

You may notice that emails now come from Arbor rather than Scholarpack.

#### Harrogate Nova Cycling Club

For a number of years now <u>Nova Cycling Club</u> have run a series of training sessions for children aged 6-11 approx. In terms of the sessions themselves:

The sessions run from late spring to early autumn on Tuesday evenings

There are 2 groups - beginners (6.00-6.30) and advanced (6.30-7.15)

The sessions are delivered by fully qualified British Cycling coaches

The sessions take place on the large car park opposite the army barracks on Pennypot Lane just outside Harrogate. As such they are on a tarmac surface but there are no cars to worry about.

The cost is £55 per year for the beginners group and £80 for the advanced group. In addition, there is a £6 fee to joining Harrogate Nova Cycling Club.
