#### Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of Love Learn Shine. We will use this section of the newsletter each week to keep families up to date with a range of key safeguarding and welfare information.

#### Sun Safety

It has been lovey to have a spell of warm, dry and sunny weather this week which is forecast to continue into the half term break. As we enjoy this lovely weather it is that time to remind ourselves and our children of the importance of keeping safe in the sun.

As part of our statutory duty we conduct regular safety drills including fire drills and lockdown drills. We will be conducting both a fire and lockdown drill at the start of next term. Children will be informed as to what to expect and why, as well as reassured that these are drills so we are all familiar with what to do in the unlikely event there was a real emergency situation.

#### **Snack Time**

While many if not all of us enjoy an occasional sweet treat, it is important we model good healthy balances to our children. We do this through our snack trolley which contains;

**Monday - Thursday.** Whole pieces of fresh fruit e.g. apples, bananas, fresh fruit pots/fruit kebabs, raisins, breadsticks, vegetable sticks, milk.

**Friday (Treat Friday)** - As per Monday-Thursday but also fruit juice, milkshake and one sweeter treat such as flapjack/blueberry muffin.

We respectfully ask that snacks from home mirror what is available in school. We are seeing an increasing number of children either bringing crisps as a snack or wanting to eat the crisps from the packed lunch at break time. Children will be politely asked to not eat these as a snack.

#### **Year 4 Multiplication Check**

The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided.
