




PLEASE name ALL uniform with a name label and not just initials in biro. Many children have the same initials. Uniform with a label is easily returned to the correct child.

Homework

With the support of parents all children are encouraged to take age appropriate responsibility undertaking homework.

Families should talk about planning when and where homework can be completed.

Each week, a phonics sheet that contains the sounds learnt and spellings to practise at home will be placed on the website e.g. /ow/ snow, grow. Repeated practice of sounds the children have learnt during the day is important for helping children retain learning.



After half term, the children will also bring home their own book and a sharing story every week. We encourage every child to read every day, and develop a love of reading. The sharing story is a great opportunity to expose your child to different types of texts, and for you to read this book to them for their enjoyment. Please record any reading you do in the Reading Record which will also be sent home.
