## Meet the Teacher

#### Arbor

Arbor is our school management information and communication system and comes with a dedicated parent app.

From the App parents can access information regarding their child's attendance as well as track their merit awards.

#### Jewellery

School preference is that no jewellery is worn as it is unsuitable during school hours. Apart from the risk of loss, these items can present safety problems to the wearers and others.

Children are permitted to wear stud earrings and a watch only. Earrings must be removed for PE unless within the first 8 weeks of having ears pierced or if children cannot quickly, easily and independently remove them. If it is not possible to remove earrings children may be asked to cover them with plasters depending on the nature of the physical activity. We politely request that no smart watches are worn in school. Any jewellery brought into school is done so at the risk of the child and family.

As in previous years we will continue to work with school staff (who volunteer their time to run clubs) and outside providers to provide a range of different clubs throughout the year.


