1. 'Change Needed' verbal reminder.

Conversation with the class teacher. Children may be moved within their classroom if considered appropriate.

2. 'Change Needed' recorded.

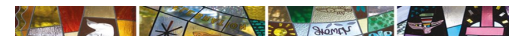
'Change Needed' recorded on Arbor. Restorative conversation in child's playtime or lunchtime.

3. 'Behaviour Incident' or repeated 'Change Needed' recorded.

'Behaviour Incidents' will be recorded on Arbor, communicated to parents and appropriate consequences considered and applied. Repeated and frequent 'Change Needed' incidents will be communicated to parents and appropriate consequences considered and applied.

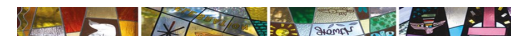

- ◆ To nurture a love of reading by sharing a variety of books and stories with your child
- ◆ Encouraging daily use of maths skills e.g. telling the time, counting
- ◆ Be active—enjoy the outdoors
- ◆ Have screen-free time
- ◆ Promote independence e.g. tying shoelaces
- ◆ Encouraging kindness by taking turns and learning to lose gracefully. Board games are great for this!

Homework

With the support of parents all children are encouraged to take age appropriate responsibility undertaking homework.

Families should talk about planning when and where homework can be completed.

Each week, you will have homework typically given out on a Thursday afternoon. This will consist of a Maths work book, and a Comprehension work book. Children are encouraged to complete one piece of homework in each book which will be set by their class teacher and return it to school on a Tuesday.

Children will also bring home their own books and a sharing story. We encourage every child to read every day, and develop a love of reading through being exposed to different types of text e.g. chapter books, non-fiction books.

The children will also be given a list of 5 spellings, typically on a Friday. They will then have a week to practise these spellings before a 'quiz' at the end of the week.
