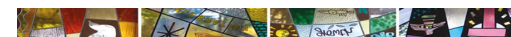

- ◆ Have screen-free time to be active outdoors and enjoy arts, crafts and music.
- ◆ Promote independence e.g. handing in homework on time, taking responsibility to learn weekly spellings, to take a more active role in school ambassador roles
- ◆ Encouraging kindness by taking turns and learning to lose gracefully. Board games are great for this!

Homework

With the support of parents, all children are encouraged to take responsibility for completing homework on time.

Families should talk about planning when and where homework can be completed.

Each week your homework will be given out on a Friday and will be marked the following Friday.

Each week, children will be given a set of spellings to learn and will be expected to write these words in sentences, so that they understand the meaning of the word and can confidently use it in their writing.

Children will also be given maths homework. This will be one page of their Schofield and Simms maths Homework book.

It is expected that children will be reading daily for pleasure at home.

PE Days

These are to be confirmed and will be communicated via the newsletter. Children will need to come into school in appropriate PE kits on these days. This is a plain white T-shirt and blue short/skorts or jogging bottoms.
