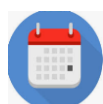


**Parenting Support**

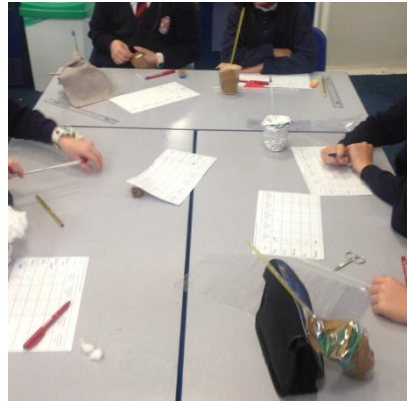


### Wren's Home Learning Phonics Books

### Upper Key Stage Two Science

Children in Year Five and Six have been exploring materials and their properties in science and have been investigating what the best thermal insulator would be to line a lunch box. Ravens were so excited to set up the investigation using a fair test and they used their scientific enquiry skills to compare their results. Eagles class will conduct their investigation after half term.

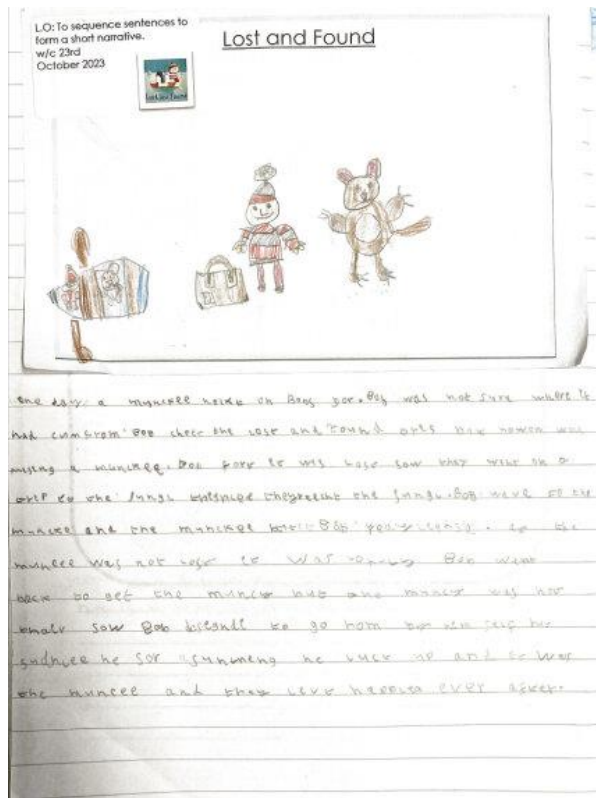


### Key Stage One Design Technology – Food Technology

Children in Key Stage One have very much enjoyed their recent food technology learning. They have been designing and making fruit skewers. They had to think about the different types of fruit that might go well together in terms of texture and flavour and how these fruits could be cut and shaped to fit well onto a skewer. They also thought about how to use the equipment safely and how to ensure they worked cleanly and safely.
