English

This term our key texts will be **'The Last Wolf'** by Mini Grey and **A midsummer Night's Dream** by Brooke Jorden.





The Focus of our writing for the first half term will be to write a letter persuading people to save the trees. We will be exploring using different adjectives and how to add 'er' and 'est' to the end of words.

The focus of our writing for the second half term will be to write detailed character descriptions. We will explore using expanded noun phrases alongside different sentence types. Thinking about a character's personality and appearance.

Phonics

Children Year 1 will all undertake a 30 minute phonics session every day. The children will learn new sounds, with the opportunity to re-visit and put their learning into practise throughout the week.

Children in Year 1 will continue to learn new phase 5 GPC's as well as continuing to revisit and review previously learnt graphemes.

Mathematics Year 1

Numbers to 20, Coins and Unitising, Time, Position and Direction

- Use knowledge of addition and subtraction facts within 10 to add and subtract within 20
- Measure length in cm
- Count in 2,5 and 10
- Know the value of coins
- Use knowledge of value of coins to solve problems
- describe position, direction and movement, including whole, half, quarter and threequarter turns.
- tell the time to the hour and half past the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.

Year 2

This term in Year 2, your child will be learning to:

- Recognise the £ and p symbol and solve simple problems using money.
- Identify one-half, one-quarter and one-third and find those fractions of a shape and a number.
- Compare and sequence intervals of time.
- Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past, half past and to the hour.
- Organise and arrange mathematical objects in pattern and sequences.
- Use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement.
- Identify patterns between the 5 and 10 time table.
 - Understand the relationship between doubling and halving.
 - Choose and use appropriate units of measurement.
 - Compare and order length and mass.

PE

The children will enjoy 2 PE sessions within the week. Please ensure your child comes to school wearing their PE kit on these days. Weather dependent the children will have their PE sessions both in and outdoors. The PE sessions follow a scheme called REAL PE. This scheme real PE gives every child the physical literacy, emotional and thinking skills to achieve in PE, Sport and life. The unique, child centred approach transforms how we teach PE to include, challenge and support every child.

There will be a focus on 4 books over the next term:



The focus for the fundamental movement skills will be co-ordination (ball skills) and agility (ball chasing)

History

This term children will be thinking about a significant historical place in their own locality from now and then.



Our key question will be

How have holidays changed over time and why?

Geography

In Geography we will be thinking about Around the World This will involve understanding geographical similarities and differences We will also spend time investigating places and through this will learn the seven continents and the five

oceans.



Science

Everyday Materials and their Uses

This term children will be learning about uses of different materials.

Children will be able to



- Name the materials an object is made from
- Name everyday materials then use their properties to compare and group them
- Explain how materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching
- Explain how suitable materials are and that they are used for various uses

Art and Desian

During the art and design unit, children will be thinking about painting and colour mixina. They will learn about primary and secondary colours, how to add tone and tint and create a colour wheel.



Children will then move on to learn about collage. Looking at techniques to cut and stick different material s to create pattern and texture. Children will create their very own seaside design.



Design and Technology

During the Design technology unit children will make a moving windmill for a Mouse.



Children will be able to

- •Follow design criteria to meet the needs of a user. •Make a stable structure.
- •Make functioning sails/blades that attach to the supporting structure.
- •Improve their windmill.



This term, children will be asked the question and given the opportunity to reflect upon:

- What helps us to stay safe?
- How do we recognise our feelings?



The children enjoy their Music sessions every other week. The unit the children will be learning about this term is:

Vocal and body sounds: by the sea





Phonics and Spelling



Children in Year 1 and 2 are given; 1 reading book and 1 sharing story **perweek**. Whilst in school, children read as a group on 3 separate occasions. When your child is fully secure in year 2 (based on the Little Wandle reading assessments), your child will move onto banded reading books and will be read with at least once a week. At this point, their reading records will be checked daily, and they can change their books when required.

It is important that at home you are reading with your child as often as you can. This may be listening to them read their decodable book or be sharing a story together. Anytime you read together at home we would love to know about it, so please let us know

about it in your child's reading record.

Every half term, an overview of the children's learning will be available on the class page, alongside weekly Little Wandle home learning sheets for Year 1. Practicing the new graphemes and phonemes children have learnt in school will help them to consolidate and retain their new learning.


Phonics Screening Check June 2024

Year 1 children will be participating in a phonics screening check where children are asked to read real words, and 'alien' words in order to check their phonetic knowledge.



Maths books and Reading Comprehension.

In year 2, children are sent home with a Maths workbook and a Reading Comprehension book every Friday, to be returned to school by Wednesday so that they can be marked. Tasks will be set weekly and the page to be completed will be highlighted. There will often be an optional extra page to do in the maths workbook which will also be marked if completed. We really appreciate all of your support in helping your child to complete both the maths activity and the reading comprehension activity every week.



In year 1, children build on their understanding of numbers to 10 and then 20. Practicing automatic recall for addition and subtraction facts to 10 will help improve their fluency and confidence.
