
## Communicate Geographically





- Europe is located in the Northern Hemisphere and forms the westernmost part of the land mass of Eurasia.
- Europe can be split into regions: Northern, Eastern, Southern and Western Europe.

• There are five major lines of latitude:



· Europe is divided into different climate zones: artic & polar, temperate and Mediterranean.



- Continent one of the seven large land masses on the earth's surface, surrounded, or mainly surrounded, by sea and usually consisting of various countries
- Climate what the weather is like over a period of 30 years or more.
- Climate zone an area that has its own distinct climate. They also have their own type of vegetation and wildlife.
- latitude imaginary lines to help locate how far north or south a place is. These lines run parallel to the Equator.

#### The UK is located in north-western Europe. KS1 Prior knowledge:

- The UK is composed of four countries: England, Scotland, Wales, and N. Ireland.
- Seas/Oceans: south English Channel; west the Irish Sea and North Atlantic Ocean and east-the North Sea.
- The capital of the UK is London.
- The Pennine Hills are described as the 'spine' of the north of England.
- Greece has a Mediterranean climate (warm, dry summers and cool, mild winters).
- The physical geography and climate of Greece has affected how land is used and where people settle.



Communicate using Key Mapping Vocabulary

cartographer	A cartographer specializes in the creation, design, and production of maps
cardinal directions	NORTH, EAST, SOUTH and WEST.
ordinal directions	NORTH-EAST (NE), SOUTH-EAST (SE), SOUTH-WEST (SW) and NORTH-WEST (NW).
Political Maps	Show country shapes and boundaries; location of places and features within each country.
Physical Environment Maps	Show the natural landscape of the Earth.
Grid Reference	A grid reference tells you where something is on a map.
