#### **Road Safety**

A child's safety will always be a top priority for any parent or carer. Keeping children safe near roads is vital because road traffic injuries are the biggest cause of death among young people worldwide, and six children are killed or seriously injured on roads every day in the UK. The road safety charity <a href="Brake">Brake</a> believe that every child has the right to make safe and healthy journeys where they live, without fear of danger from traffic. They have a range of resources that families scan use to help build upon the work undertaken in school to teach the children about road safety. It is important children continue to have these messages revisited and repeated at home and in school.

## Monday 10 June 3.15 – 4.00 and Thursday 13 June 4.00 – 4.45pm.



## Your child's reading journey **Year 1 Phonics Screening Check**

#### **Key Stage One Road Safety**

Children in Key Stage One have been studying road safety as part of their recent PSHE learning. Having completed classroom-based lessons learning about the green cross code and different types of safe crossing spaces and places. They took their learning outside onto the playground and then on a local walk around school to test out their knowledge and use their new skills. The children used both a zebra and pelican crossing to cross the road in small groups safely. They remembered when they cross the road to 'Stop, Look, Listen, Think!'



#### **Collective Worship**

This week we have looked at Pentecost in our worship. Pentecost is known by Christians as the 'Birthday of the Church'.

In the Easter story we learn of when Jesus died on the cross and then rose again from the dead on the first Easter Sunday. The Bible says that after 40 days, having appeared to the disciples and others many times, Jesus went back into heaven.

The followers of Jesus had got very used to having him around, both when he was alive and after the Resurrection. Now they were on their own again, with a huge task to complete. How would they be able to spread the good news of Jesus without him there to lead them? But Jesus had prepared them for this. A few days after Jesus had gone back to heaven, his followers were meeting together. After Pentecost, the followers of Jesus had new confidence and strength to spread the message of Jesus right across the known world.
