From September 2024 Mrs Jones will become our Assistant Headteacher with responsibility for Inclusion and Personal Development.






From September 2024 Mrs Crankshaw will come our Assistant Headteacher with responsibility for Curriculum and Assessment.

#### **Global Writing Workshop**

Children from across Key Stage Two participated in Pobble's live lesson this week with children from across the world. We watched Mr Blower give us tips and tricks on how to improve our writing and then we wrote a creative piece of our own based around a photo. Some of our ideas were even read out to the other 10,000 children watching too!







#### Writing in Herons

Herons class have been studying the wonderful world of Roald Dahl through their text, "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory".

They have worked really hard to write in the style of Dahl to write their own story opening, describing Loompaland in fantastic detail.

Take a look at some of these setting descriptions...can you tell your Dahl from your Herons student?

Thank you to everyone who took part and supported this. We hope you enjoyed yourselves.








#### **Art and Design**




#### **Art and Design**

#### Junior Parkrun Take Over

Sunday 12th May, St Peters' are doing a take-over of Harrogate Junior Park Run. We would love to see as many students as possible come to take part in the run or help volunteer.

The junior parkrun is a free, weekly, fun, and friendly 2km event for young people between the ages of 4 and 14. The Harrogate run is a 2-lap course round Valley Gardens.

Starting point - The Magnesia Well Café, The Valley Gardens, Harrogate, HG1 2SZ.

Parkrun organise a warmup before the run at c.8:50. Then run will start at 9am and lasts for approximately 10-20 minutes, depending on your pace.

There will be adult marshals all around the course and a tail walker (so that no one will finish last).

Whatever the pace, your child can run or walk the course. You can run or walk the course with your child - if you can keep up!
