## Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of <u>Love Learn Shine</u>. We will use this section of the newsletter each week to keep families up to date with a range of key safeguarding and welfare information.

#### Food. Entertainment. Arts. Sport. Together.

We want to ensure that we provide the best possible education, supporting children to shine. A healthy meal at lunchtime is an essential part of this.

As you may know, families that meet certain criteria (see below) may be eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals. We want to support our families to apply to receive these for free wherever applicable. Alongside free lunch during term time, being registered for benefitsrelated Free School Meals also entitles your child to free activities and meals during the Easter, Summer and Christmas holidays through FEAST.



Further, when students are registered for benefits-related Free School Meals, our school receives additional funding ('Pupil Premium'), which is pooled and used for extra support and initiatives throughout school. It's vital for everyone that all children who are eligible for Free School Meals are registered as such.

#### What do I need to do?

Many families qualify for benefits-related Free School Meals without realising. We would encourage families to apply, even if they have been unsuccessful in the past or if you believe you are not entitled. You can apply for Free School Meals on the North Yorkshire Council website here: <u>https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/education-and-learning/free-school-meals</u>

#### Eligibility criteria for benefits-related Free School Meals:

Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods (£616.67 per month)

Income Support

Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance

Income-related Employment and Support Allowance

Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 the guarantee element of Pension Credit Child Tax Credit, provided you are also not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)

Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive Free School Meals. Because of this, **these children are not registered for benefits-related Free School Meals unless the family applies**. This means the school does not receive the Pupil Premium for these children, which reduces the amount of support and initiatives we can provide. You may also experience some disruption in receiving Free School Meals when your child moves into Year 3. We would encourage all families with children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 who think they may be eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals to apply using the information above. #### Fire and Lock Drills

As part of our routine health and safety rehearsals and drills we conducted fire and lock down drills on Monday this week. The lock down drill is simply the children rehearsing having to come in immediately from an outside activity in the event of an issue such as sudden air pollution. The children were briefed in advance of these drills and approached them incredibly sensibly and maturely. Thank and well done to them all.

## Curriculum & Extra-Curricular Spotlight

#### Key Stage 1 Design Technology

Children in KS1 have been looking at structures as part of their DT learning. Children received a brief design criteria from their client, The Little Mouse. They then set to work designing a windmill for the mouse to live in and creating their structure whilst thinking about how to make the structure stable.









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#### Year 1 Phonics Screening and Year 4 Multiplication Check

Well done to all the children in Year 1 and Year 4 who have undertaken their national assessments this week. Children in Year One have undertaken the phonics screening check and children in Year 4 their multiplication check.
