Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of <u>Love Learn Shine</u>. We will use this section of the newsletter each week to keep families up to date with a range of key safeguarding and welfare information.

Sun Safety

It has been lovely to see some warmer sunnier weather in recent days. As we hopefully begin to welcome the summer weather on a more regular basis it is a good time to remind ourselves about keeping safe in the sun. We request that families ensure children have appropriate sun hats and water bottles available in school and apply a high factor (50+) sun screen before school. Fiddle Magnet Balls

We have become aware of some children playing with and bringing into school what are commonly known as 'fiddle magnets'. These shiny and sweet-like magnets appear to be attractive to children and are often prompted as a sensory toy appropriate for children. They can however cause serious harm if ingested.

Georgina Malakounides, consultant paediatric surgeon at Addenbrooke's Hospital, said:


"If these magnets are swallowed, the magnetic attraction between the balls could cause significant damage to the child's digestive system. This includes making holes in the intestine and causing life-threatening bowel twists, requiring emergency surgery.'

We strongly advise that parents do not provide children with this type of toy and politely insist that these magnets are NOT brought into school under any circumstances. We have a wide range of safe, appropriate child friendly sensory equipment in school for use as needed.

Headlice

Head lice are very common in young children and their families. They do not have anything to do with dirty hair and are picked up by head-to-head contact which can increase when children are at school mixing with other children. We have been made aware of some recent cases of headlice and are happy to share the following <u>link</u> to NHS advice on the treatment of headlice.





As stated in the guidance it is not possible to prevent headlice and there is no need for children to be off school if they have headlice or if there are cases of headlice in school.


