As we begin a new school year, we have been thinking about the Love element of our vision in particular everyone feeling they belong.


Love

Through education we have the privilege to be able to engage directly with children and young people who:

are passionate about the natural world, want to do their best to protect it, can influence their wider communities.

Sustainability and climate change: a strategy for the education and children's services systems - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

We know that regular contact with green spaces can have a beneficial impact on children's physical and mental health. In the Children's People and Nature Survey for England: Summer holidays 2021, more than 8 in 10 children and young people (85%) agreed that being in nature made them very happy. However, the same study showed that children spend less time outdoors as they get older and feelings of connection to nature decline with age.

In and around Harrogate, we are extremely fortunate to have a diverse range of green spaces in which children and families can relax, explore and create.

DARE to BELIEVE Program

In todays world, we understand the value of having confidence and believing in ourselves. Eventually we realise, it might be only ourselves that prevent us from achieving our goals and what we want. But... Its never too late to change and make a difference in your life. This program is designed for children to reinforce positive beliefs about themselves. Have their confidence boosted and understand what they do or say makes a difference in their life. This program enables children to start believing in themselves and opening themselves up to accomplishing their dreams and ambitions. They are in a safe space, allowing them to explore what they like. They will have positive values instilled within themselves

During your child's class, they will:

- · Explore their own dreams and future aspirations - open creativity
- · Seek what adventures they want to achieve (add pictures into workbook)
- · Learn to say positive things about themselves & others- Build self confidence
- · Encourage self-awareness, staying positive & demonstrate acts of kindness.
- · Discover and write about what they are grateful and thankful for.
- · Be inspired by what others have achieved e.g. Stephen Hawking, Helen Keller, Jack Carroll and more...
- · Mini-meditation techniques / Tapping positiveness / breathing / visualisation
- · Story telling from Children's Chicken Soup for the Soul
- · Safe space to share thoughts and opinions
