Flu Immunisations

A reminder that Vaccination UK will be coming to St Peter's school on **Friday 25th October** to administer flu vaccinations.

For your child to receive their Nasal flu vaccination in school, please click <u>here</u> and complete a YES consent form using the link below. If your child cannot have the Nasal spray, the injectable flu vaccine is available, and you will be able to choose that method on the consent form.

If you DO NOT wish for your child to have a flu vaccination, please complete a NO consent via the same link here.

Please note that it is not possible to administer a flu vaccination on the day if you have not completed a YES consent form. It is also not possible for us to take verbal consent on the day or follow up with families who have not completed the form.

Non completion of the form will be taken as not consenting and children will not receive the vaccine.

School aged flu vaccinations



In the past some families have raised concerns suggesting they need to keep their unvaccinated child out of school on the day of and sometimes in the days following the flu vaccination rollout, because of fears that the droplets of recently vaccinated children could be inhaled.

The nasal spray vaccine has a good safety record and unvaccinated contacts are not at risk of catching flu from the vaccine, either through being in the same room where the flu vaccine has been given or by being in contact with a recently vaccinated individual. Although vaccinated children are known to shed virus for a few days after vaccination, it is less able to spread from person to person than the natural infection. The amount of virus shed is normally below the levels needed to pass on infection to others and the virus does not survive for long outside of the body. This is in contrast to natural flu infection, which spreads easily during the flu season.

Excluding children from school during the period when the vaccine is being offered, or in the following days or weeks, **is not necessary and any absence on this ground would be unauthorised.** There is no evidence that healthy unvaccinated people can catch flu from the nasal flu spray (either from airborne spray droplets in the room where the vaccine is given, or from vaccinated individuals 'shedding' the virus).

Pick Up and Drop Off Parking

We appreciate families having ongoing journeys after picking up and dropping off and are often working to tight timescales. While recognising this please can we politely remind everyone that we should all still park legally, considerately and thoughtfully to each other and our neighbours. Where they are in place please observe and park accordingly to the double yellow lines and the school markings.

All parents are entitled to collect a laminated parking permit which allows them to park on Victoria Avenue without needing to use the pay and display machines at pick up and drop off time. While recognising this is a short walk it is also a safe and legal way to park.

Photo Consents

Thank you to everyone who has completed the updating of their photo permissions via the Arbor Parental Portal, this is a big help. We are pleased to have been selected by Playscheme to feature in their updated catalogue both in print and online. They have commissioned a professional photographer to take photos of their installations including the Scramble Stax, outdoor classroom, library and The Nest. They will be coming to do this next week on Tuesday 22 October They would like these photos to include children using them. We have added an additional consent option on Arbor and would be most grateful if parents would complete this additional consent request for 'School Approved Third Party' photos. Even if you choose not to consent, we would most grateful if all families would respond either giving or declining their consent.

Personal Social and Health Education (PSHE)


