Nest Renovation

We are all celebrating the completion of our newly renovated nurture room space. Nurture and pastoral care are at the heart of the school's approach.

The Nest was initially created back in Autumn 2021 transforming a storage room into nurture space for use during lesson time, lunchtime and by the schools after school provision Fun Club. Initially the room was cleared and repainted however there was ambition to create an inspirational space that brought the children's thoughts and ideas to life. All the classes at St Peter's are named after birds from the book 'The Lost Words' and continuing this theme the children named the nurture space 'The Nest' as it is a safe and welcoming space for children from all classes to meet and be together. The school worked closely with the York based company Playscheme to develop the design, including the children's wish for their very own school treehouse. Throughout last year school completed several bids for additional funds including a successful application to the Johnson and Mukherjee Foundation to support this project as well as working closely with Friends of St Peter's FOSP to raise the funds needed for this project.

We are very lucky to have a fabulous FOSP group who work incredibly hard to arrange events for our school community and raise funds to support projects in school.

Cookbook

FOSP is delighted to be getting your tastebuds tingling by creating a school recipe book this year. We would love your children to contribute a recipe to the cookbook.

It's really simple. Your child can create or choose a favourite recipe from home - a breakfast or snack, a starter, main or dessert, either healthy or a treat. They need to enter the ingredients, the method (in easy-to-follow steps) and then either take a photo of their finished dish, or draw a picture of what it looks like.

Children may submit a recipe individually or as a group (for example siblings who are all a huge fan of Grandma's secret pasta bake recipe can submit it together as long as Grandma is happy to share the secret!) but there is only 1 child photo per page so make sure you send in a snap with all the siblings in it.



Support for young people's Mental Health in North Yorkshire





Free Beds through Essential Needs



This year, Essential Needs has launched a scheme to offer free beds for children to support families in the Harrogate District.

Furniture poverty remains a very real issue facing families in our community and we're here to help. This year we've already given away a number of beds to families where children were having to share with siblings or sleep with a parent.

If your child is in need a bed of their own, we still have many more available.

The family of the child receiving the bed just need to meet the following criteria.

- The child receiving the free bed must be under the age of 16 when the referral is made.

 The parent/guardian with whom they are living must be in receipt of a means tested benefit or low income which has been verified by either the referring organisation or Essential Needs.

- The parent/guardian must not be currently eligible for, or have received a bed for this child within the past 2 years via The North Yorkshire Council Local Assistance Fund.

- The child & parent/guardian must not be living in temporary accommodation, such as a hostel or living with a family member or friend. Your permanent address must be in the Harrogate District.

- The child must not have received a bed free of charge from Essential Needs under this or any other scheme in the past 3 years.



Exciting News from North Yorkshire Children and Families Service!



North Yorkshire Children and Families Service are excited to launch their new NYES [North Yorkshire Education Services] landing page. Please Scan the QR opposite.

The aim of the Children and Families Service – Early Help page is to ensure information is relevant and accessible for those supporting children, young people, and their families.

The information available supports the guidance within Working Together to Safeguard Children 2023, ensuring that families receive well-informed responses that prioritise safety and wellbeing of the child, young person, and their family. The new landing page enables agencies to have access to key information and resources, supporting them in their delivery of early interventions and ensuring children and their families receive consistent and empathic responses providing the "right support at the right time by the right person".

The landing page contains evidence-based tools that support a signs of safety and strength in relationships approach when working with children and their families.

The landing page offers information on a range of topics such as parenting, parental conflict, FEAST and Psychologically Informed Partnership Approach (PIPA). An ideal and easy to navigate tool for schools and early years practitioners ensuring a supportive and consistent approach when working with children and families in North Yorkshire.

most appropriate resource at the earliest opportunity therefore reducing the need for further referrals and targeted interventions at a later point. This is a more beneficial solution for both families and educational professionals.

When effectively used, the suite of early intervention tools can enable children and their families build resilience, identify their own networks of support, and explore their own solutions to emerging worries.

Having tools and links available in one easy to navigate place will build staff confidence in the information shared with families and will reduce time spent searching for resources.
