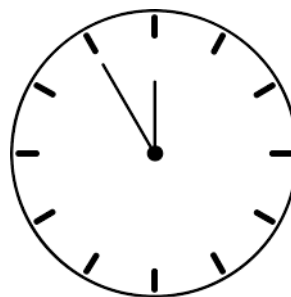
### **Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing**

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of [Love Learn Shine](#). We will use this section of the newsletter each week to keep families up to date with a range of key safeguarding and welfare information.

#### **Morning Drop Off**

It has come to our attention that some children are being dropped off at school in the morning unattended before 08.40am.

Whilst the school gates are opened at 08.35 each morning, Parents are reminded that they need to stay with their children until 08.40 when staff are available on the playground, not left unattended in the reception waiting area or in the playground. #### **Sleep Support**

Having a sleep issue is surprisingly common. At any given time up to 40% of adults and 50% of children (this rises to 80% with a SEND diagnosis) have difficulties with their sleep. Yet in a recent survey, almost 60% of adults felt there was a lack of support for sleep issues. Sleep problems can leave people feeling isolated and lonely.

The [National Sleep helpline](#) is run by a team of specialist trained sleep advisors. Although we cannot give medical advice, we can talk through your issues, offer you some practical strategies and recommend services that could help.



#### **Reach Out – Anonymously If Needed**

We are here to help and always appreciate when families get in touch direct with any worries or concerns.

We appreciate there may be occasions where children or families wish to report a concern or worry anonymously. This can be done in writing via letter sent in the post to *St Peters CE Primary School*,



Belford Road, Harrogate, North Yorkshire, HG1 1JA.

We have also set up an online [Anonymous Concern Report](#) for families to use if necessary.

Anonymous reports will always be looked into based on the information provided however it will not be possible to provide feedback and exploring the concern may be more difficult when it is not possible to speak directly with the person raising the concern.

### WhatsApp Warning

We have been made aware of a concerning WhatsApp group that is circulating.

There are reports that over 900 children have been added and the children are encouraged to keep adding more people. The messages shared within the group have been reported as alarming, containing adult material, threatening behaviour, and even messages urging children to harm themselves. The group is identified as "Y7 (any school so keep adding)." If children have access to WhatsApp, we would advise that parents/carers should speak to their children about the dangers of joining a group when the participants are unknown. You may also wish to check your child's phone to ensure they have not been added to this or similar groups.

The minimum age for using WhatsApp is 13 years old in the UK.

### Behaviour and Attendance – Thank You & Well Done

In line with our vision of Love Learn Shine we work hard with children and families to support them to attend and behave well. We are grateful for all the support families give us in these areas.

We are delighted that last half term 135 children had a 100% attendance record, and 150 children had a record of 98%+.

We appreciate families having ongoing journeys after picking up and dropping off and are often working to tight timescales. Where they are in place please observe and park accordingly to the double yellow lines and the school markings.

All parents are entitled to collect a laminated parking permit which allows them to park on Victoria Avenue without needing to use the pay and display machines at pick up and drop off time. While recognising this is a short walk it is also a safe and legal way to park.

### K.R.Ali Taekwondo Academy

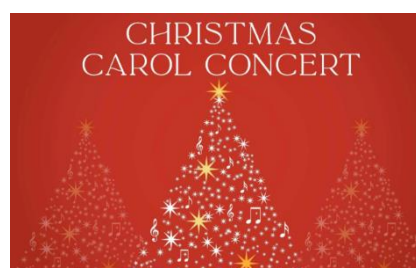

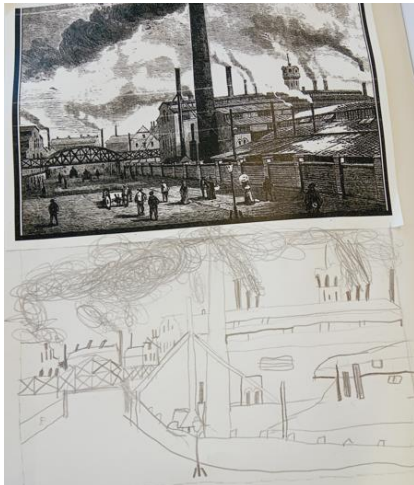
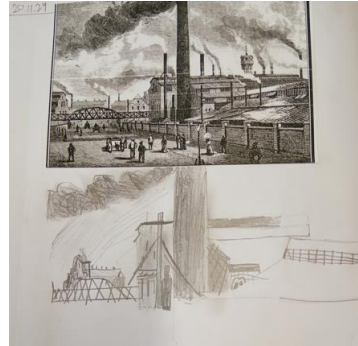

## Getting it right for children

When parents are separating or separated, children can often get caught in the middle.

*Getting it right for children* is a free online course designed to help you parent co-operatively. It can help you to develop positive communication skills, so that you can sort out disagreements and find solutions together.

**You will learn:**

- How to stay calm and listen as well as talk.
- Why it's helpful to see things from a different point of view.
- What to do to stop a discussion from turning into an argument.
- Skills for finding solutions and making compromises.

To access the course, you will need a smartphone, tablet, or computer, and a good internet connection. It's FREE to use, so you'll just need to create an account with a username and password.

- *Getting it right for children* is designed for separating or separated parents who want to reduce conflict and communicate better with their child's other parent.

## Santa toy appeal returns to support struggling families



Local residents are being urged to donate unwanted toys and games to ensure more children wake up to a gift on Christmas Day.

In its sixth year, the Reuse Santa toy appeal is run by the Yorwaste waste management company in partnership with North Yorkshire Council and City of York Council.

It aims to help families who are struggling with the cost of living by finding a new owner for pre-loved toys.

Donations are being accepted from 18th until 30th November at all the Household Waste Recycling Centres (HWRCs) which are operated by Yorwaste. Last year, a record 5,000 items, or 30 van-loads, were donated for children and teenagers who might not otherwise receive a gift at Christmas.

This was an increase of about 2,000 items from the previous year.

The donated items will be sorted, cleaned and distributed to local organisations and charities including Early Help, No Wrong Door, Ryedale Special Families, Colburn Hub and Community Café and the British Heart Foundation.
