Child Accident Prevention Trust

More than ever our Christmas shopping is done online from an increasingly varied list of providers. From imitation manufacturers, to sellers platforms like Etsy and to third party small businesses that use known provider logistics services, we're all trusting people ever further removed from us to provide high quality goods. Unfortunately, this is far from guaranteed. Production firms abroad or within a 'cottage industry' may not have the strict manufacturing standards applied in the UK, or expected as industry standard. The Child Accident Prevention Trust has published a list of eight gifts most likely to cause an accident this year It's always important to remember that prevention is always better than repairing. Sleep Support

Having a sleep issue is surprisingly common. At any given time up to 40% of adults and 50% of children (this rises to 80% with a SEND diagnosis) have difficulties with their sleep. Yet in a recent survey, almost 60% of adults felt there was a lack of support







for sleep issues. Sleep problems can leave people feeling isolated and lonely.

The <u>National Sleep helpline</u> is run by a team of specialist trained sleep advisors. Although they cannot give medical advice, they can talk through your issues, offer you some practical strategies and recommend services that could help.

Santa toy appeal returns to support struggling families

Local residents are being urged to donate unwanted toys and games to ensure more children wake up to a gift on Christmas Day.

In its sixth year, the Reuse Santa toy appeal is run by the Yorwaste waste management company in partnership with North Yorkshire Council and City of York Council. It aims to help families who are struggling with the cost of living by finding a new owner for pre-loved toys. Donations are being accepted from 18th until 30th November at all the Household Waste Recycling Centres (HWRCs) which are operated by Yorwaste.

Last year, a record 5,000 items, or 30 van-loads, were donated for children and teenagers who might not otherwise receive a gift at Christmas.

This was an increase of about 2,000 items from the previous year.

The donated items will be sorted, cleaned and distributed to local organisations and charities including Early Help, No Wrong Door, Ryedale Special Families, Colburn Hub and Community Café and the British Heart Foundation.




