Safe Snacking



We would like to formally welcome Mr Parkinson who has joined us this week as maternity cover for Miss Wilson.





We are very excited to be able to offer two early years groups at Harrogate Music Centre. These groups are designed to help young children develop a love for music and improve their cognitive skills. Led by experienced teachers who use age-appropriate activities such as singing, dancing and playing musical instruments, your budding young musicians will develop their communication, emotional intelligence and build their confidence in these sessions.

We currently offer the following sessions which each last 35 minutes:

09:30-10:05 – Musical Munchkins – For children aged 2-4, accompanied by 1 parent. **10:15-10:50 – Sound Explorers** – For children aged 5-7, unaccompanied.

These sessions are free for the first half term and then will be charged at £40 per term.

Musical Munchkins takes place from 09:30-10:05, and Sound Explorers from 10:15-10:50 – both based at St Aidan's High School on Saturday mornings during term time.
