#### **Martin Powell**


We were delighted to welcome our community PCSO Martin Powell into school this week. Martin came to deliver road safety awareness sessions to all our children from Early Years to Year Six. Martin made use of the THINK road safety materials to help children understand the important messages of how to keep themselves and others safe when using the pavements and when travelling with adults on the roads. There are some great follow up resources and activities that families can look at on the THINK website.

#### **Free Sensory Training for Families**

Let's Talk - Sensory Processing -Tuesday 01st April; 10.00am and 7.15pm

This session for parents and carers of children with SEND will focus on sensory preferences, differences and how to find a calm state. The session has been developed in partnership with NYC Inclusion and NHS Occupational Therapy. Sessions will consider the following questions:

- What is sensory integration?
- Why do people respond differently to their environment?
- What is the purpose behind actions?
- ls it ok to intervene and how do we go about it?
- How can we develop self-regulation?



# **General News**

#### **Walking Bus**



It was great to see so many walkers join our walking bus from the Stray, each enjoying the benefits of stretching their legs before the start of the school day. A walk is a great way to start the day. It is great for our physical and emotional wellbeing and helps reduce the number of vehicles on the road.

We were delighted to welcome Mr Smit our Trust external adviser into school this week alongside with Mrs Parker one of our Governors. Mr Smit is a registered Ofsted inspector as well as a school adviser and brings a wealth of experience to his role. He spent time discussing and reviewing our school development strategy as well as working with Mrs McNichol looking at Science across the school, visiting all classes. He was impressed with the attitudes to learning displayed by all the children and commented positively on the work of children in Year 5 Herons who made cell models of bacteria, fungi and viruses from playdough including the added challenge of adding DNA or a nucleus to the cell models. He will return in the summer term to undertake a focus look at the personal development opportunities for children.





#### **Broadband Switch**

As part of our ongoing digital amplification and resilience work, we are moving Broadband providers. The switch must take place in line with the contract ending and a new contract commencing with the date outside of our control. The switch over date is **Tuesday 1 April 2025.** We have been assured continuity of service will remain, however we are taking precautions in case there is an interruption to service. School will be fully open on this day however if there was any temporary interruption to our service this would impact on our phone system which like many other schools and business is internet based. We have school mobile phones for emergencies and if necessary, will share the number with families should it be necessary.



As mentioned in the newsletter last week leaders including governors will review the outcomes at the next meeting of the governing board in April. Following from this we will write to all families with a summary including any proposed action the school will take following on from the feedback received. Thank you to everyone who took time to respond. Your feedback has been received and will be reviewed and considered carefully. We will update further in the summer term.

### **Drink Bottles**

As the weather is starting to feel warmer, please can all children remember to bring a water bottle with them each day, with their name clearly displayed on it. We are starting to see an increase in children not having drink bottles with them in school.

#### **Shelter Installation**

Thank you to everyone for their patience as we have been working on upgrading our Butterly Garden area with the addition of a new covered shelter, equipment storage, outdoor chalk board and outdoor book boxes.

We are very much looking forward to fully opening this area soon. The final stage is to complete some surfacing repairs around the area and then secure the bench seating. Once this work is completed, which should take place next week or over Easter, we will open the area for use.

#### **Governor Vacancy**

Please note that spaces on a specific club last term are not guaranteed on the same club this term, therefore all children will need to rebook on any of the clubs.


If anyone would like to book their child(ren) onto any of the paid clubs and are finding it financially difficult to cover the costs, please do speak to the office who will chat through options.


