Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of <u>Love Learn Shine</u>. We will use this section of the newsletter each week to keep families up to date with a range of key safeguarding and welfare information.

Road Safety

As I am sure families are aware the zebra crossing outside the library is currently out of service.

We will continue to speak with the children in an ageappropriate way to discuss general road safety messages as well as the specific risks at present in and around school as well as how to minimise these risks. If your children walk some or all the way to school by themselves, please do talk to them about safe crossing places. There are some excellent tips and hints available at THINK Road Safety. While it does not fully replace the zebra crossing there are a set of traffic lights and an island at the Waitrose and Stray ends of Victoria Avenue. In the absence of the zebra crossing, we advise that families needing to cross Victoria Avenue do so at either end. If your children walk part or some of the way to school by themselves, we suggest you advise them of these alternatives.



A polite reminder that it is our position that no child needs any type of mobile phone to attend St Peter's School. If parents feel it is essential for safety of children who are walking to or from school independently then a request for mobile phone to be brought into school form must be completed and phones must be handed to the school office upon arrival at school and collected from the office at the end of the day.

If children are bringing phones into school and then being collected by an adult, we will politely and respectfully question the necessity of the phone being in school.




