




Term Dates

General News

Children's Workbooks & Assessments

On Wednesday and Thursday next week children will come home with some or all of their workbooks from the year. For children in Year 1, 3 and 5 this will only be some of their books as they will take other books through to the following year group. If children could bring a strong carrier bag to school on Wednesday this would be of help for them in carrying books at the end of the day. Children will also bring home copies of their summer term assessments. These have helped to inform the teacher judgements in their end of year school report. These will be sent in a sealed envelope. These will give families an idea of the style and type of questions children are assessed on.



Following on from the success of our whole school prayers spaces event earlier in the year we are delighted to be, once again, working with staff and volunteers from St Peter's and St Paul's churches to run a special one-off prayer space event for our children in Year 6. This will take place in small groups in St Paul's church during Tuesday next week. There will also be an opportunity between 3.00pm – 3.30pm for parents from any age group in school to visit the space should they wish to see the activities the children will have had access to or simply take a moment for themselves within their day to reflect. The spaces can be accessed through the side door of St Paul's church (next to school).









Last Day of Term

We are pleased to provide information regarding the final day of the school year which will be Friday 18 July. School will finish at 2.00pm with Year 6 exiting in their usual red-carpet fashion to the front of school. Please ensure children have someone to collect them at 2.00pm or they are booked into Funclub

Shirt signing: Children in Year 6 may bring a spare school shirt to have signed. This must be a spare shirt in addition to the shirt they are wearing on the day.

The unnamed lunchboxes and water bottles around the side of school under the bike shelter will all be disposed of after the final day. Please check this if you are missing any lunchboxes or water bottles.

First Week Back

We will write to all families on Monday 1 September with details of the first day back for children, which is Tuesday 2 September.

Physical Education (PE) lessons will start in week two of term so children should wear full school uniform throughout the first week. We will write to families at the end of the first week to inform them of PE and swimming days during the autumn.

PE Footwear

In recent weeks we have noticed an increasing number of colourful trainers being worn on PE days and sometimes on non-PE Days. We appreciate occasionally towards the end of term children have grown out of school shoes and families are waiting until the summer to purchase new for September. On this basis we will allow a degree of leniency with this over the final week of term. We would like to politely remind everyone however ahead of September that children should wear black trainers only on PE days. In September we would expect this to be the case for all children without exception. Please bear this in mind when making purchases of new PE trainers. Black school shoes should be worn on all other days.

Curriculum & Extra-Curricular Spotlight

Food Technology

Owls really enjoyed the start of their DT project. They tasted biscuits and commented on taste, texture and appearance. They also looked at the packaging and reviewed the target audience. We then watched a model of how to make and bake a plain biscuit and next week we will be designing packaging and creating our own tasty biscuits.

Creative Writing

Children in Herons have been completing a creative unit inspired by Judith Kerr's 'When Hitler Stole Pink Rabbit'. This semi-autobiographical classic, written by the beloved Judith Kerr, tells the story of a Jewish family escaping Germany in the days before the Second World War. They took on the role of the main character Anna, and wrote a letter recounting her first day at her new school in Switzerland. In their letters the children managed to get across Anna's feelings and opinions as well as providing a snapshot as to what life was like for this family pre-WW2. The children have really enjoyed the book and have produced some brilliant pieces of writing. They have also presented them creatively in fold out old-fashioned travel trunks.
