Updated Road Markings



Kindness Book and Work


It all starts with a crack that we can hardly see, It happens when we shout or if we disagree. But with every kindness that we care to show Something good and magical will begin to grow.

Children from across all classes have really enjoyed exploring the ideas above via the thought-provoking book Kindness Grows' by award-winning author and illustrator Britta Teckentrup.

In this beautifully illustrated, affirming picture book poignant text is mixed with gorgeous illustrations to show us how the choices we make can bring us together or drive us apart reinforcing the inspiring message that kindness can grow something beautiful.

The children have produced a lovely range of written and artistic work including poems, stories, and kindness promises, which are now on display in and around school. We are delighted to share some examples of their work opposite.
