
Please do ensure coats are also clearly labelled with your child's full name. Thank you in helping us to get out into the fresh air each day for our break times.

Togetherness: Supporting Families in North Yorkshire

What is Togetherness?

Togetherness is the new name for *In Our Place* in North Yorkshire — a fresh identity that reflects our commitment to building stronger, more connected families and communities. Developed by the **Solihull Approach**, a not-for-profit NHS service, Togetherness offers a wide range of **free online courses** designed to support emotional health, parenting, and relationships for families across the county.

Why the Change?

The rebranding to *Togetherness* represents:

- A more inclusive and relatable identity for families in North Yorkshire.
- A focus on connection, support, and shared learning.
- A clearer message that these resources are available to everyone, regardless of background or level of need.

How Do People Use Togetherness?

Togetherness courses are:

- **Completely free** for North Yorkshire residents and professionals.
- Accessible anytime, anywhere courses are delivered online and can be followed
 at your own pace.
- **Modular and flexible** short modules fit easily around busy family life.
- **Universal** available to all families, not just those receiving support.
- Accessible easy to translate in to many different languages

Getting Started

To access the courses, residents and professionals simply need:

- Their **postcode**, or
- The access code: NYfamilies

They can register for as many courses as they like.

How Professionals Can Use Togetherness

Professionals working with families are encouraged to:

- Signpost families to Togetherness courses as part of their support.
- Use the courses in one-to-one sessions with parents who may need help accessing digital content or who cannot attend group programmes.

- For women couples




Early Years Stay and Play
