Progress score in reading, writing and maths

Schools are given a value-added progress score for each subject. A score of 0 means that children in school on average do as well at KS2 as those nationally who have a similar prior attainment. This prior attainment data is from their end of KS1 data.

A positive score means that children in school on average make better progress by the end of KS2 than those nationally who have a similar prior attainment.

A negative score means children in school on average do not make as much progress by the end of KS2 than those nationally who have a similar prior attainment. A negative score does not mean that children are not making progress at school, there is a sliding scale
