#### **Photos at School Public Events**

We are looking forward to welcoming families to a number of events and performances over the coming weeks and know these moments are precious. As we approach these events it is a good opportunity to remind everyone about photo etiquette and expectations at school public events. Families are welcome to take photos and videos of their own children for personal use, but please do not share them publicly online without consent from everyone featured. Once posted, images can be copied, altered, and remain visible for years, which

may compromise children's privacy and security. Al tools now make it easy to manipulate photos, so extra caution is needed. Some children cannot appear online for safeguarding reasons, so sharing without permission could put them at risk. Our school may take official photos for internal use, respecting any opt-outs. Please also avoid blocking views when recording and ensure if you are using your phone to take photos it is on 'silent'. Thank you for helping keep everyone safe.

#### **Photo Consent Update**

We've written to parents about changes to photo consent and included a summary below. Please read the full letter attached with this week's newsletter.

From January 2026, photo consent will be simplified from eight options to four:

- 1. **No photos**. Your child will not appear in any photos taken by the school.
- 2. Professional Individual photo only. Professional Individual photos taken annually and shared directly to the individual child's parents / carers, by the Professional photographer's website. Photo will be used on our school Management Information System (MIS) which is Arbor and used by school directly with the individual child's parents / carers, for example on the front cover of your child's school reports.
- 3. **Professional annual class photo**. Your child will appear in the annual class photo which will be shared with all parents in the class via the professional photographer's website.
- 4. **External and internal publication**. Photos may appear in printed format around school, on our website, in newsletters, social media, or local press (children will never be named).

Please update your child's consent in Arbor by 6 January 2026. If we don't hear from you, we'll assume no consent. Existing consents will be archived on 19 December 2025. For queries, email <a href="mailto:admin@stpeters.ycst.co.uk">admin@stpeters.ycst.co.uk</a> or call 01423 569684.

#### **Your Harrogate Christmas Toy Appeal**

Ensuring that every child wakes up to a gift on Christmas Day remains the aim of an annual countywide toy appeal.

In its seventh year, the Reuse Santa campaign encourages residents to donate pre-loved toys, games, books, and puzzles in a good condition.

The appeal is run by the 'Yourwaste' waste management company in partnership with North Yorkshire Council and City of York Council.

From November 15 to 30, donations will be accepted at all household waste recycling centres. All items must be clean, complete, and in working order.

Last year, 5,000 items, or 30 van-loads, were donated for children and teenagers who might not otherwise receive a gift at Christmas.

Toys powered by mains electric cannot be accepted. Site operatives at the recycling centres will be on hand to accept donations, as well as advise on recycling or disposing of items that are unsuitable.

The donated items will be sorted, cleaned and distributed to local organisations and charities including the council's early help team, the British Heart Foundation, and the Daisy Chain Project.





#### We teach in 91% of secondary schools and 95% of primary schools in North Yorkshire

#### The County Music Service provides tuition in a wide variety of instruments:

Brass: cornet, trumpet, trombone, horn, euphonium, tuba; Woodwind: clarinet, flute, oboe, saxophone, bassoon; Strings: violin, viola, cello, double bass; Guitars: classical, acoustic, electric; Percussion: tuned percussion and kit; Voice and Keyboard/piano

Up to 32 lessons per year are offered to pupils in small group or individual lessons. These take place mostly during the school day and are available to pupils attending schools throughout North Yorkshire. Lessons are sometimes available beyond the end of the school day or on Saturdays at music centres. Rotating Timetables allow for minimal disruption to the school day. Regular contact through Practice Diaries and Termly Reports ensure that parents are in contact with the Teacher and can support their child's practice at home.

Instruments are available to hire or can be bought using our assisted purchase scheme - see website for more details.

We also run six Saturday morning music centres across North Yorkshire.
