Your Insight into Life at St Peter's Each Week

What a truly fantastic week it has been in school, filled with energy, creativity, reflection and community spirit.

A key moment at the end of the week saw our Year 6 team welcoming writing moderators into school. This important part of our assessment process reflects our ongoing commitment to ensuring that our judgements are accurate, robust and consistent. It was a valuable and professionally enriching day, with staff working collaboratively to moderate writing, share expertise and learn from colleagues beyond our school. We are incredibly proud of both the high standard of writing produced by our pupils and the dedication of our staff in continually striving for excellence.

Earlier in the week, our governing body met on Monday for what was, as always, a highly productive and purposeful discussion. Governors play a vital role in the strategic life of the school, and this meeting focused on shaping priorities for 2026 to 2027, as well as reflecting on how they can continue to support effective monitoring and evaluation across the school. We were also pleased to be joined by our Trust's Chief Operating Officer, whose insights and contributions added further depth to the conversation. We are very grateful for the time, challenge and support our governors provide in helping to ensure the very best for our children.

Across the school, there has been so much to celebrate. We were proud to support Drowning Prevention Week, led by the Royal Life Saving Society, helping children understand how to stay safe around water, an essential life skill, particularly as we move into the summer months.

Our Sports Day on The Stray was another standout moment. Despite a slightly drizzly start, the day quickly brightened, just like the spirit of our children. It was wonderful to see such enthusiasm, determination and teamwork on display, with every child given the opportunity to shine.

Creativity has also been flourishing in our classrooms. Year 2 children have been inspired by The BFG to create a beautiful collaborative mural celebrating life at St Peter's, truly capturing the imagination and joy of learning. Meanwhile, Year 5 have been exploring Holst's The Planets, expressing their musical understanding through thoughtful and artistic responses, while children in Herons have been combining science and design to bring electrical circuits to life in innovative ways.

Beyond the classroom, our Climate Crew enjoyed an inspiring visit to RHS Harlow Carr, deepening their understanding of sustainability and wellbeing. We are equally proud of the 21 children taking part in the Archbishops' Young Leaders Award, demonstrating leadership, compassion and a real desire to make a positive difference in the world. And of course, we must celebrate our incredible team of parents whose efforts in the Harrogate Bed Race embodied teamwork, determination and community spirit, values we hold dearly here at St Peter's.

All of this reflects what makes our school so special, a vibrant community where children are encouraged to dream big, work hard and care deeply.

Attendance Matters- Update & News

Attendance Matters

We know that everyone works hard to support children to attend well. We also understand there are many reasons why children may not be in school some of which can be complex. When this happens, we are always here to help offering support, understanding and guidance, including helping children re-integrate when they return.

Strong attendance is best achieved when we work together, so please keep us updated. This might be giving advance notice of absence, ringing or emailing promptly on the day, or engaging with us when we reach out.

You can also keep track of your child's attendance using the Arbor app. Every small action helps ensure children feel supported and ready to learn.



Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of [Love Learn Shine](#). We will use this section of the newsletter each week to keep families up to date with a range of key safeguarding and welfare information.

Drowning Prevention Week

This week, St Peter's has supported Drowning Prevention Week, with children across school learning vital, age-appropriate water safety guidance. Key messages included swimming in supervised areas, following safety signs, understanding open water risks such as cold temperatures and currents, knowing what to do in an emergency, using the "Float to Live" technique, and never attempting a rescue themselves but seeking adult help.

In Herons class, children applied this learning in swimming lessons, including swimming in clothes to simulate an accidental fall into water and practising rescue techniques under expert supervision.

Please talk to your children about water safety this week:

- Supervise closely around water
- Use appropriate safety equipment
- Stay with friends and inform adults
- Follow lifeguard guidance

Together, we can keep all children safe.



Safety Drills

Due to unforeseen circumstances, our planned safety drills have been rescheduled and will now take place on Monday 22 June. As part of our systematic approach to health and safety, children will take part in both fire and lockdown drills. They will be carefully briefed beforehand, reassured, and supported throughout by familiar adults.

During the fire evacuation drill, children will practise our legally required procedures, moving calmly to designated assembly points. During the lockdown drill, children will return to classrooms, secure windows and blinds, and wait quietly for the 'all clear'.

Each drill will last around ten minutes. Children typically manage these routines with maturity, and staff will closely monitor wellbeing at all times.

Big Future Survey

Parents and carers are invited to support children at St Peter's School to take part in The Big Future, a national survey led by the Children's Commissioner for England. The survey gives children and young people aged 0–18 a chance to share what they enjoy, the challenges they face, and their hopes for the future. Children's views will be kept private, and there are no right or wrong answers. Taking part helps ensure that children's voices from our community are heard by Government and reflected in future decisions. Open Classrooms

We are delighted to invite families to our Open Classrooms this coming Tuesday from 3.30pm to 5.00pm. This is a wonderful opportunity to come into school with your children and see the work they have completed this year. You will be able to look through books, view displays and celebrate progress together. Class teachers will be available for informal conversations and to answer any quick questions you may have. This is a relaxed drop-in event, so please feel free to arrive at any time between 3.30pm and 5.00pm. Everyone is very welcome and we look forward to sharing this special time with you and your children. We hope as many families as possible can join us.



Free School Meals

We are sharing an important update about Free School Meals (FSM) and upcoming national changes that will take effect from September 2026. These changes may mean that more children are entitled to a free, nutritious school lunch each day. Under the new arrangements, all families in receipt of Universal Credit will be eligible for free school meals, with two categories in place: Targeted FSM (which also brings additional funding and wider benefits for children) and Expanded FSM (meals only). Although applications cannot be made yet, families will still need to apply to ensure children are correctly recorded, unless they are already registered. Transitional protections will end in July 2026, and eligibility will be reviewed annually each September.
