Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of [Love Learn Shine](#). We will use this section of the newsletter each week to keep families up to date with a range of key safeguarding and welfare information.

World Cup Awareness

As the World Cup gets underway, many families will be enjoying the excitement of football together. However, it is important to recognise that this period can also see an increase in domestic abuse incidents. This is not caused by football itself, but reflects patterns of harmful behaviour that may become more visible at such times. You might have already read about the link between domestic violence and England World Cup games. It all stems from a study from Lancaster University that uncovered some very uncomfortable statistics namely that when England lose a World Cup game, incidents of domestic violence increase by 38% and (even more shockingly) by 26% when they win.

At St Peter's, we are committed to safeguarding children and supporting families. We are raising awareness so that signs of domestic abuse in both adults and children can be recognised early, and support accessed quickly.

If you, or someone you know, needs help, local and [national services](#) are available. Together, we can create a community where children feel safe, supported, and heard.



Safety Drills Big Thanks You

We are pleased to let you know that our recent fire and lockdown drills have been successfully completed. The children approached both activities with impressive maturity, calmness and care, following instructions carefully and supporting one another throughout. Staff took time to explain each step clearly beforehand, ensuring children felt reassured and confident about what to expect.

These drills are an important part of school life, helping to ensure everyone knows how to stay safe in an emergency. We are very proud of how well the children coped and how responsibly they carried out each routine.

Thank you to parents and families for your ongoing support in reinforcing the importance of these procedures with your children.

Children sign up at their local library to start the challenge, which is to read six books over the summer break.

They can choose any books they like, as long as they're from the library, e-books and audiobooks borrowed from our digital platform Borrowbox and Wiley also count.

Reading or listening to books with grown ups or siblings also counts towards completing the challenge.

For each book read, children will be awarded 100 stars. When complete, they are presented with a reading certificate, a certificate and medal.
