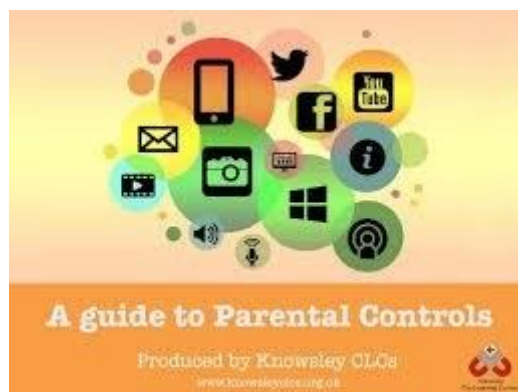


Safeguarding, Welfare & Wellbeing

Safeguarding and Welfare will always be our very highest priority in helping us achieve our vision of [Love Learn Shine](#). We will use this section of the newsletter each week to keep families up to date with a range of key safeguarding and welfare information.

Online Safety – Parental Controls

Keeping children safe online can feel overwhelming, but simple steps make a big difference. Most devices, apps and broadband providers include free parental controls that help limit screen time, block inappropriate content and manage who children can communicate with. Setting these up on home WiFi, mobile devices and games consoles creates a safer digital environment. However, no filter is perfect. Regular conversations about online activity are just as important, helping children understand risks and make good choices. Check privacy settings on social media, use child profiles on streaming services and enable SafeSearch where possible. Reviewing settings together as children grow will ensure protections stay appropriate and effective for your family's needs. Holiday Support

We hope all families enjoy a peaceful and relaxing holiday, but we know difficulties can arise. Holidays can be a difficult time for many reasons.
