Intake and Classes

From September 2024 St Peter's CE School has been a single form entry school. This means each year we admit up to 30 children in a single year group class. Children progress through the school in this single year group class from Reception to Year 6.

The class names have been chosen by the children and inspired by the book "The Lost Words". Children begin their school life in Wrens class.

St Peter's Admissions Frequently Asked Questions

We are pleased to answer some of the most common frequently asked questions regarding admissions to St Peter's CE School.

Question	Answer
1 Do you have to live in catchment to get a place at St Peter's?	No. Many families with children attending our school live well outside our catchment area.
2 Do you have to attend church and be a Christian for your child to attend St Peter's CE School?	No. We are proud of our Church school distinctiveness and 'Excellent' SIAMS outcome. We are fully inclusive of children of all faiths and none. St Peter's has no admission criteria relating to church attendance or religious observance. The school does not impose or expect Christian belief.
3 Is St Peter's significantly oversubscribed?	No. We are proud to be a popular choice, however we typically accept the vast majority of children who wish to join our school family.
4 If I apply sooner than other families, am I more likely to get a place?	No. All applications are processed after the January deadline in line with the admission code and admission criteria .
5 Is it hard to park at pick up and drop off time?	No. There are a range of parking options close to the school as well as a natural staggering at the start and end of the day with children accessing before and after school care. There is short term FREE parking on Victoria Avenue at pick up and drop off time for all families.

Families can apply for primary school places from **12 October 2026** (for Reception September 2027) [online here](#).

The **deadline** to apply is **Friday 15 January 2027**.

The last date to make a change to an application or to submit a late application is **19 February 2027**.
